Explanation of the Almanack.

Immediately after the month, the Phases of the Moon are described. The signs ☉ ☽ ☾ ☿, shewing severally New, First Quarter, Full, and Last Quarter. After which the first column contains the days of the month and week; the second the day of the year; third, Holidays, Vigils, and Remarkable Events; fourth, the Sun's rising and setting, the middle row of figures denoting the minutes *after* the hour of rising, and *before* the hour of setting, whilst the first figure shows the hour of rising, and the last of setting; fifth and sixth, the morning and afternoon tides at London Bridge.

N.B. The thick black line between the first and second columns shows the duration of the Law Terms.

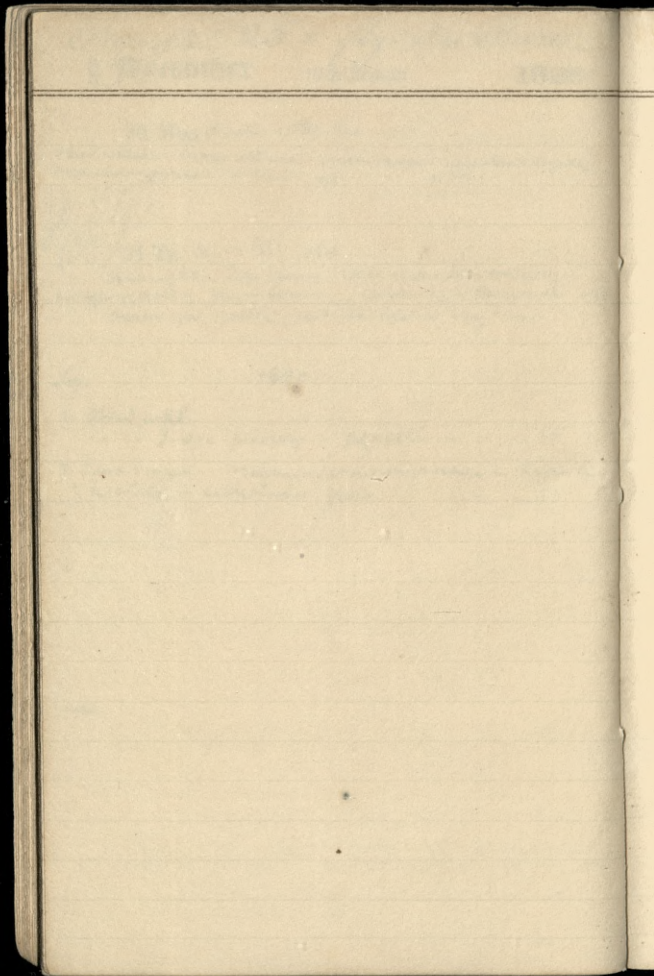

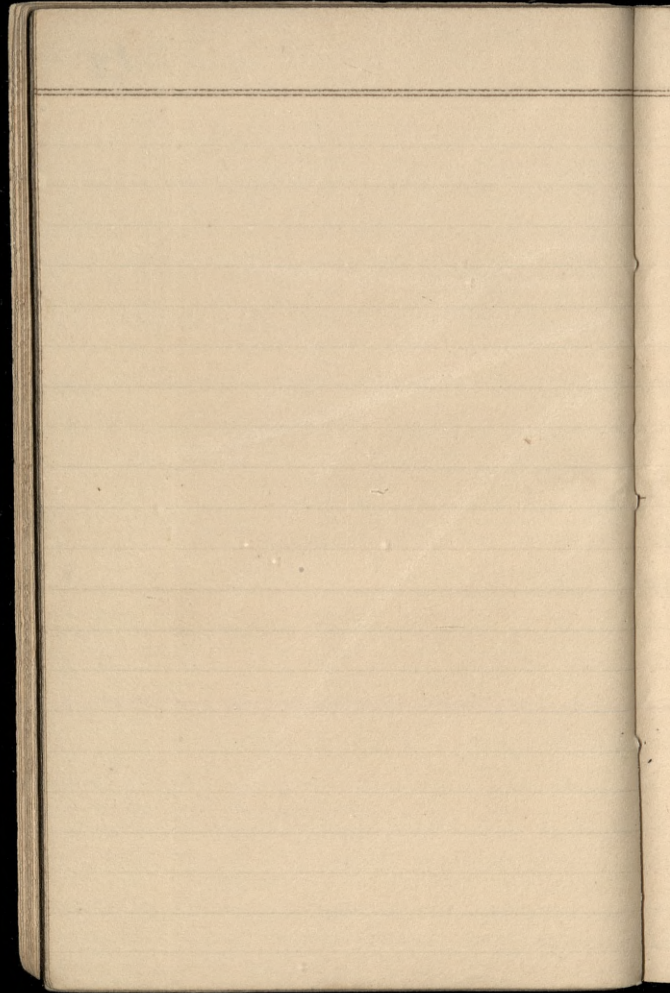

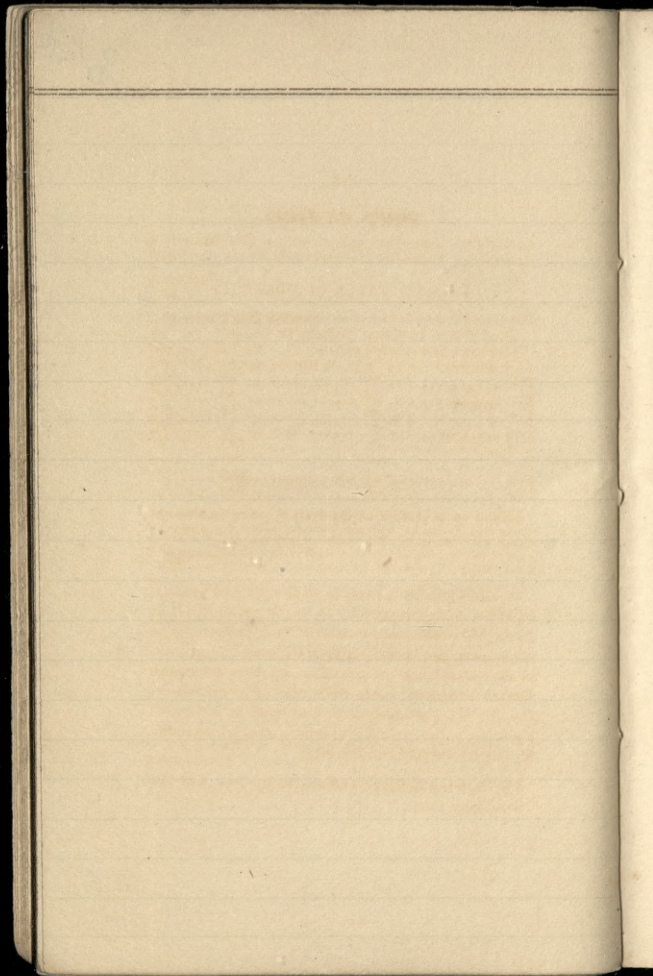
