Last Quarter. After which the first
column contains the days of the
month and week; the second the
day of the year; third, Holidays,
Vigils, and Remarkable Events;
fourth, the afternoon Tide at Lon-
don Bridge, that of the morning
averaging half an hour earlier.

N.B. The thick black line between
the first and second columns shows
the duration of the Law Terms.

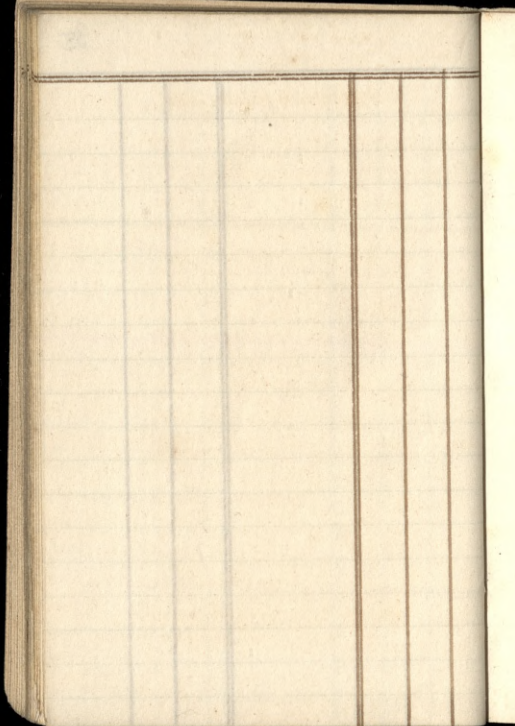
