Dear Sir,

I have received a letter from a publisher in Paris containing a request to choose for him four plates from among the English prints; and to ascertain the cost of printing them off here. These plates are to appear in a prayer book intended to be placed in the hands of Ladies. The plates must be exquisitely fine and taken from the paintings of the first masters - as Raphael & others. "The holy family" is to be one of them. The number of copies requisite will be 500 or 750 of each. - I enclose you the length & size of the book - that is of one page. - I shall be writing to-morrow to Paris; and I would be glad to be glad able to give the publisher the information required. - I must beg of you therefore 1st to tell me of the possibility of collecting such four plates, secondly, to give an estimate of the cost of printing them, thirdly to send me, if possible, some specimens that I might send them to Paris; and lastly, if you are willing to undertake the thing. - At all events I shall expect an answer from you against 4 or 5 o'clock to-morrow morning which I shall forward to Paris in In France and on the Continent the preference is given to English Engravings, and this is the reason that the Publisher had applied here; and as I know no one better calculated to do justice to the ^{than yourself} undertaking, I had no hesitation in applying ^{to you} the moment such a request was made. -
