My dear Sir,

You will have the goodness to do what it will be in your power to do on behalf of the Gentleman whom I beg to introduce to you - Capt. Stolzmann is a friend and a countryman of mine - A box containing his clothes, which were used during our campaign for even amongst the articles there is a Polish sword, and many other small articles of habilliment, besides some pamphlets and his private papers which are very valuable to him ^{is deposited at the Customhouse at present} - In the bill of lading which was sent to him - his box containing the above articles is styled ~~in it~~ "a Case Merchandise" - The charges ~~are~~ already ~~to~~ ^{to} ~~high~~ amount to a sum which was not anticipated by my friend - and he has made up his mind to leave the thing at the Customhouse ^{if} they shall subject him to any vexatious charges - Have the goodness to look to that - and free the property of my friend which contains his dearest reminiscences - It would be absurd to get ~~the~~ possession of these articles as it were by ~~an~~ auction.
