My dear Dr. Niedzwiecki

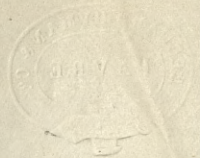
You must always feel extremely flattered on the receipt of a letter from me as it is always to trouble you with some favour. to do for me -

this time it is to request you to be so kind as to pay for me to a shirt maker in the Rue Vivienne named Gedalge he cheated me in some shirts - I thought I sent them all back but one which I had hinted I'll is that one Jewish paid for so that I may refuse the bill he has drawn on me payable the 15 of this month - when I sent back the shirts I wrote him a letter telling him that they were not made to my measure. but as I ordered them but that if he would send me 3 others immediately I would take them this is about a month ago - since which time I have heard nothing of him - so I write him now to tell him not to send any thing -

Good night of the 15th I hope you will enjoy a trip to Paris - but I could not at this moment spare the time or the money - thanking you in advance

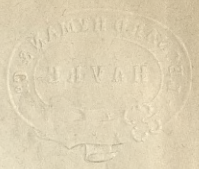

My dear Mr. Medgewick

I am in receipt of your letter of 12th & am much obliged to you for your kindness the first opportunity I will send you the 9 frs disbursed by you I hope that the case will never come to a judgement if my only witness warns me against his decision I am glad to hear that Mr. Palmer is getting better I think that the fine weather he had last week must have done something for it As Mr. Fisher told me that he was very fidgety about his crops whenever he saw rain he had a most brilliant fire here yesterday consisting of 2 salutes of cannon - a review of about 8000 men - including the Compagnies & about 20 rockets as fireworks in the evening - I hope you got on a little better in Paris -
